EPIC! Rule # 3: If you are not having fun, you are playing someone else's game

Is it possible that this is only week 4 of the new year? My how time flies when you are having fun AND playing your game. That doesn't mean that the game is easy.

My husband Rob and I just got back from a fabulous week at the Modern Elder Academy in Baja where we plumbed the depths of the challenges of "Finding the Magic in Midlife". It turns out that the average Midlifer - ages 45 - 80 - is going through at least 10 transitions all at the same time. Economic, professional, personal, spiritual, and relational. Trap doors open up, pathways get blocked, glass skylights become ceilings, colleagues get triggered, loved ones become sick.
